Letter from the Executive Director

Happy Winter!

As winter sets in, I love to think of cozy nights reading my book by the fire; my husband working on his novel, my daughter on her homework. A cup of hot tea in hand and my American Eskimo dog sleeping nearby round out the image of an idyllic winter night.

While I occasionally have these types of evenings, the reality of winter is much different. The darkness on my way to and from work really gets to me. My instinct is to hunker down and hibernate. And I do mean hibernate—huddled under a blanket, isolated and alone.

The problem is—I'm not a bear. Hibernation is really not good for us humans. We're designed to be in community. In 2023, the US Surgeon General's advisory council released a paper on the epidemic of loneliness. It's actually worse for our health to be lonely than to drink six alcoholic beverages a day, and half of U.S. adults report experiencing loneliness. Social connection is a significant predictor of longevity and better physical, cognitive, and mental health, while social isolation and loneliness are predictors of premature death and poor health.

I'm confident that our library can help with this epidemic. It's why we work so hard to create programs that will get people out of the house and get them together to meet people with similar interests.

It's also why our staff work so hard to make you feel seen and welcome when you're in our buildings. They create opportunities to stop and chat with your neighbor while you're there. Stopping by your local branch and being greeted by a familiar staff person can make you feel less lonely.

I've resolved, this winter, to get out more instead of hunkering down—to attend events, meet new people, and connect with old friends. I'd encourage you to do the same.







WEREHERE FOR A REASON.

Thriller author Brendan Slocumb credits music with saving his life.

locumb describes himself as growing up in a rough part of Fayetteville, North Carolina. Early on, his passion for the violin provided an opportunity for meaningful engagement that kept him out of trouble. His dedication to the violin led to a career as a musician and music educator. He's played with prestigious symphonies, earned a degree in music education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and connected students with the language of music for more than two decades.

Then, 2020 hit. Covid. Lockdown.

Bookings for musical performances slowed to a stop. Students weren't going to classes. Slocumb was struggling financially. On a whim, he sent an old science-fiction manuscript to a literary agent to see if it'd stick. It didn't quite land, but the agent challenged him to

write what he truly knew. And if there's anything Slocumb knows, it's the power of music. Slocumb's debut thriller novel, The Violin Conspiracy, came out in 2022. It was a grand success. The story follows Black classical musician Ray McMillian, whose priceless heirloom violin is stolen on the eve of the biggest classical music competition in the world. The Violin Conspiracy draws on Slocumb's lived experiences with racism in

the classical music world to craft a mystery that deftly explores family expectations, greed, and coming of age.


The Violin Conspiracy was a Good Morning America Book Club pick and a Goodreads Choice Award winner. Both are high honors and represented a rising career for the novelist.

Slocumb's sophomore novel, Symphony of Secrets, meets a selfimposed challenge: keeping his concept of the classical music thriller fresh and engaging. In Symphony of Secrets, we delve more firmly into the territory of historical fiction. A professor discovers that a famous American composer has stolen his music from a young neurodivergent Black woman. This novel explores the timely question of how to address history's wrongs and who gets to have their story told.


His latest novel, The Dark Maestro, treads into new territory while keeping some familiar scenery. We follow Curtis Wilson, a classical music prodigy who has done the impossible: used his gifts and grit to force his way out of life in inner-city DC and into the upper echelons of the classical music world. Curtis is only able to enjoy his success for a while. His father's drug dealings run him afoul of a powerful kingpin, and the whole family must go into the witness protection program. When law enforcement isn't able to bring the drug cartel down, the family must take them on themselves-using Wilson's music.


All of Slocumb's thrillers weave together elements of musicality with suspense. If you're wondering where to start for yourself, I'd recommend The Violin Conspiracy for fans of family dramas, Symphony of Secrets for fans of dual timelines, and The Dark Maestro for fans of fast pacing.



FREE INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

Taxes due Tuesday, April 15, 2026

In collaboration with the Mendoza College of Business at the University of Notre Dame, Saint Mary's College and the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA) through Goodwill Industries, the St. Joe County Public Library is offering free income tax preparation for Indiana residents. Income limits apply.

Limited to federal and state of Indiana forms. Both taxpayers must be present if filing a joint tax return.
