Letter from the Executive Director


Happy Winter!

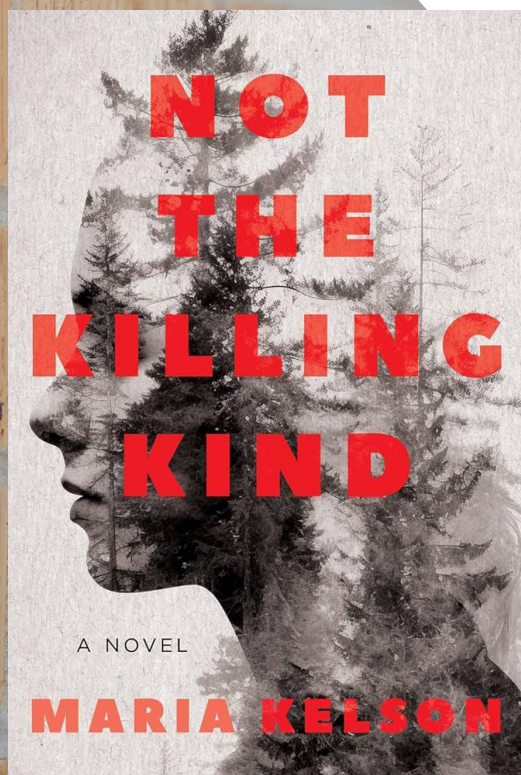
A New Chapter in Storytelling

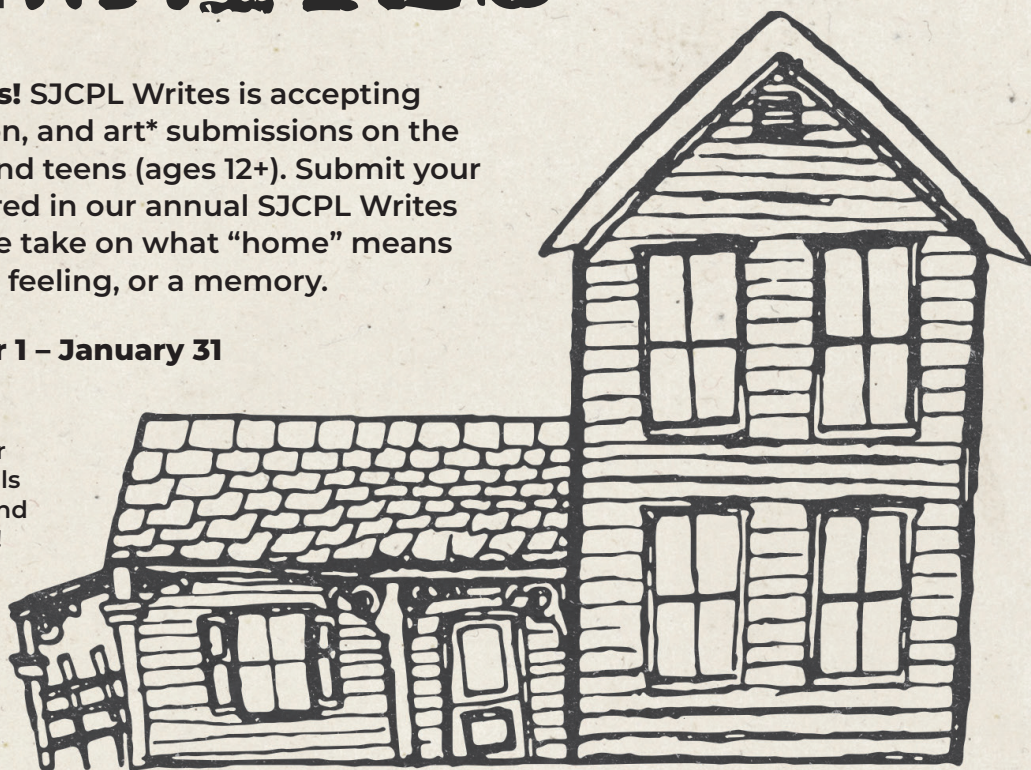

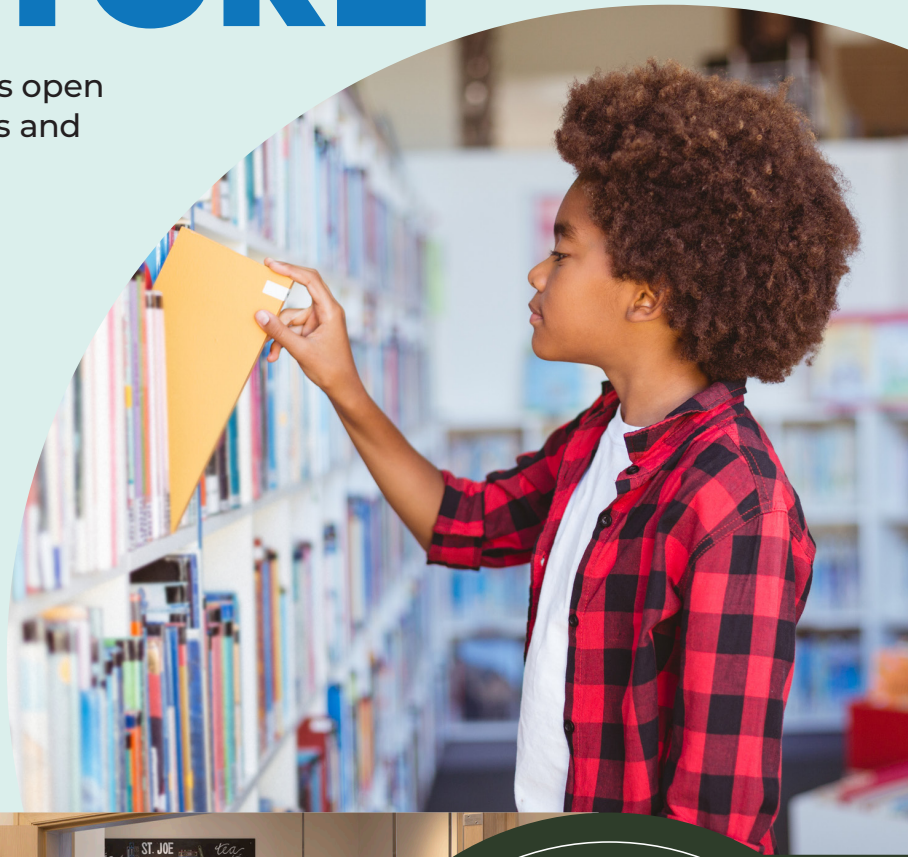

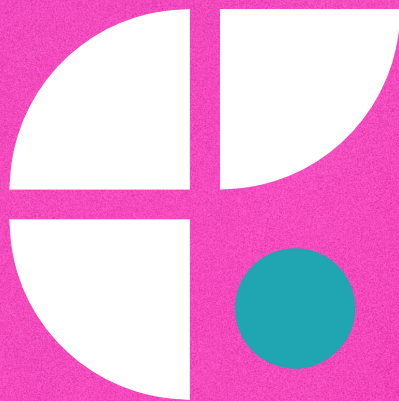
